

Adam McEwen 'Tinnitus' The Modern Institute, Osborne Street 4 June – 27 August 2016

Taking its title from the central work in this exhibition, *Tinnitus* is comprised of a steel banding sculpture splicing across the gallery space, several large-scale photographic images printed on sponge and punctuated by rough iron piping, and a car airbag cast in iron.

Pulled together by a continuity of materials and the intention to define a constant, invisible force – a sound in a sculptural form – the exhibition expands on themes central to McEwen's practice, revealing a disquieting resistance within the very familiar.

Adam McEwen (b. 1965, London, lives and works in New York) studied BFA at California Institute of the Arts (1991).
